GUEST ARTISTS

Laila Biali, vocals and piano

Multi award-winning Canadian singer-songwriter, pianist and CBC Music national radio host Laila Biali has headlined festivals and venues spanning five continents from New York City's Carnegie Hall to Beijing's National Centre for the Performing Arts, and supported international icon Sting. Her latest full album release, Out of Dust, received rave reviews and was nominated for a 2021 JUNO Award. In 2020, Laila was honoured by SOCAN Music with the Hagood Hardy Award for Excellence in Songwriting. In 2019, Laila's eponymous release won her a JUNO (Canada's GRAMMY) for "Vocal Jazz Album of the Year." The year prior, she was awarded top prize at the Canadian Songwriting Competition in the Jazz category.

Laila was also the youngest-ever double winner at Canada's National Jazz Awards when she was named "SOCAN Composer of the Year" and "Keyboardist of the Year." She received her first JUNO nomination for Tracing Light (2011), and a spot on DownBeat Magazine's "Best Albums of the Year" for Live in Concert (2013) and Out of Dust (2020). In September of 2017, Laila was brought on as the host for CBC Music's national radio show, Saturday Night Jazz, a weekly show broadcast to millions of listeners across Canada. While Laila continues to earn high honours in the Jazz world, her signature sound transcends genre as she "masterfully mixes jazz and pop, bringing virtuosity and unpredictability to songs that are concise and catchy" (Washington Post). Laila is currently rolling out singles from her latest project, Your Requests, Volume 1, which features dynamic and personal arrangements of jazz classics requested by her listeners. The full album will be available in 2023.

Scott Good, conductor and orchestrator

Toronto born Scott Good is a unique creative voice in the Canadian music scene as a composer, conductor, concert producer, arranger, and trombonist. As an orchestral composer he has been commissioned by many orchestras including L'Orchestre Symphonique de Montreal, National Arts Centre Orchestra, Esprit, Kitchener-Waterloo S.O., Winnipeg S.O. and the Vancouver S.O. where he was composer in residence (08-12). Major works include The Hands of Orlac, a 2 hour tour-de-force accompanying the silent film classic, and Le Baiser, and musical portrayal of Rodin's masterpiece. Scott has composed numerous chamber works, including a multi-disciplinary work Wu Xing for the Gryphon Trio and Cuban traps virtuoso Dafnis Prieto, and a Canadian tour as composer-trombone soloist with ECM+ in his riotous Shock Therapy Variations

He is currently Composer-in-Residence with London Symphonia. In this role he has composed new works, arranged music and conducted concerts, developed youth programs, and acted as part of the artistic planning team along with the Artistic Advisory Council.

David B. Weaver, choir director

Mr. Weaver has taught music in London since 1989 and is Head of the Music Department at H.B. Beal Secondary School. His choirs have received numerous honours & awards. Mr. Weaver received his Bachelor of Music & Bachelor of Education from the University of Windsor, Master of Music Degree in Choral Conducting and Piano from the University of Cincinnati, Associate in Piano Performance degree from the Western Ontario Conservatory of Music (Conservatory Canada) and studied voice (opera and oratorio) with Russian Bass-baritone Igor Saika-Voivod. Mr. Weaver has conducted choirs at national & provincial conventions of the OMEA, CMEA & ACCC, and performed on Maclean-Hunter TV, Rogers TV, CTV, and CBC Television and Radio and on numerous choir tours across Canada, the USA & Europe. He founded The London Singers in 2000 and continues to be active as a conductor, musical director, soloist & church music director.

He would like to thank his parents, former teachers and professors and all current and former students and choir members over the years for so many wonderful memories and great music and he is excited to be back to LIVE performances!

The choir performs many concerts each year and has received numerous gold awards at the London Kiwanis Music Festival including receiving the Earle Terry Rose Bowl for best choir in the festival and the Alex Clark Challenge Class Trophy. The choir has also won awards in the Ontario Provincials and Musicfest Nationals.

The London Singers was founded in 2000 by conductor and artistic director David B. Weaver. The choir's mission is to make a meaningful artistic contribution to the London, Ontario region and nurture the spirit of the people of this community through the joy and gift of music. The choir's chief aim is to put young people in the midst of great music through collaborations with the H. B. Beal Secondary School Singers, local elementary schools, community, church, university & professional musicians. They are a recent Forest City Music Award Winner for Best Classical Choir.

The London Singers and H. B. Beal Singers have collaborated for 23 years and notable performances include concerts at Carnegie Hall, at Lincoln Centre, at the National Arts Centre for Canada 150 and at Notre Dame Basilica in Montreal. Their last collaborations with London Symphonia included "Beethoven Bash" concert and "Merry and Bright" seasonal concert in 2019, a concert with Sarah Slean in 2020 and recently "Mozart Mash" on Nov. 27, 2022 at Beal Auditorium. The choirs are delighted to be part of today's presentation of "By the Fireside" with Laila Biali.
