# THE PERFORMERS

# Sarah Slean, singer-songwriter

Signed to Atlantic/Warner Records at the tender age of 19, three-time Juno nominee and modern-day Renaissance woman Sarah Slean has since released 11 albums in over 10 countries worldwide – but perhaps the most astonishing aspect of her artistry is its breadth. Over her 20-year career, Slean has published two volumes of poetry, starred in short films and a movie musical (spawning two Gemini Award nominations), penned two string quartets, held numerous exhibitions of her paintings, and shared the stage with 10 of the country's professional orchestras.

Classically trained from the age of 5, she routinely collaborates with cutting-edge contemporary classical ensembles like The Art of Time, and has been invited to sing world premieres by Canada's leading living composers. Citing such diverse influences as Leonard Bernstein, philosophy, Joni Mitchell, Buddhism and Bach, her music borrows aspects of cabaret, rock, pop, and orchestral: all knit together by the startling poetry of her lyrics, virtuosic piano-playing, and that voice, described by the CBC as "a 19th century Kate Bush".

In addition to headlining theatres across Canada, Sarah has also toured Europe, the US and Scandinavia and has opened internationally for such artists as Bryan Ferry, Rufus Wainwright, Alanis Morissette, Andrew Bird, Feist, Ron Sexsmith, Chris Isaak, and Buck 65. Metaphysics, her first recording in 5 years, is described as a breathtaking amalgamation of Slean's dramatic orchestral arranging and her signature take on songwriting.

# Scott Good, conductor

Toronto born Scott Good is a unique creative voice in the Canadian music scene as a composer, conductor, concert producer, arranger, and trombonist. As an orchestral composer he has been commissioned by many orchestras including L'Orchestre Symphonique de Montreal, National Arts Centre Orchestra, Esprit, Kitchener-Waterloo S.O., Winnipeg S.O. and the Vancouver S.O. where he was composer in residence (08-12). Major works include The Hands of Orlac, a 2 hour tour-deforce accompanying the silent film classic, and Le Baiser, and musical portrayal of Rodin's master-piece. Scott has composed numerous chamber works, including a multi-disciplinary work Wu Xing for the Gryphon Trio and Cuban traps virtuoso Dafnis Prieto, and a Canadian tour as composer-trombone soloist with ECM+ in his riotous Shock Therapy Variations

He is currently Composer-in-Residence with London Symphonia. In this role he has composed new works, arranged for and conducted concerts, developed youth programs, and acted as part of the artistic planning team along with the Artistic Advisory Council.

# **The London Singers**

The London Singers is a charitable foundation formed in 2000 by conductor and artistic director David B. Weaver. The choir's mission is to make a meaningful artistic contribution to the London region and nurture the spirit of the people of this community through the joy and gift of music. Their chief aim is to put young people in the midst of great music through collaborations with the H. B. Beal Secondary School Singers, local elementary schools, the London Singers Orchestra, community, church, university and professional musicians. The London Singers, together with the Beal Singers, have performed many classical choral masterworks over the past 20 years here in

London as well as in New York City, at Lincoln Centre and twice at Carnegie Hall. They have represented Ontario at Unisong in Ottawa for official Canada Day Celebrations several times, performing at the National Arts Centre with the NAC Orchestra on Canada Day.

The singers you will hear tonight are a new division of the choir, and we are pleased to present the performance debut of The London Singers - Youth Edition. This small group of young singers have paved a new path for choral singing, rehearsing on their own, virtually, masked, distanced, and even outdoors. They have shown us that masks and social distance cannot diminish their dedication, enthusiasm and incredible sound as you will hear tonight. We are thrilled to be performing again with London Symphonia and with the amazing Sarah Slean in this ground-breaking concert. Thank you for your support and this great opportunity!


