

BIOS



Payadora Ensemble

Founded in 2013, Payadora features some of the most respected chamber musicians in Canada: Rebekah Wolkstein* (violin, vocals), Drew Jurecka* (bandoneon, violin, mandolin), Joseph Phillips* (double bass, guitar), Mark Camilleri* (piano) and Elbio Fernandez* (vocals). Payadora's broad scope in tango draws from the height of Buenos Aires' Tango tradition, including compositions by De Caro, Pugliese, Troilo, and Salgan, to the masterful, contemporary sounds of Astor Piazzolla and beyond. They compose and arrange their own repertoire.

Recent awards include the 2024 Folk Music Ontario Award for Best Album for "Silent Tears: The Last Yiddish Tango." The album reached No. 1 on the World Music Charts in Europe, accompanied by rave reviews, airtime, and press coverage around the globe, including the BBC, CTV, CBC television and radio, the Bangkok Post, NPR, and RTE Irish Public Radio. They have been named on "Best of" lists on NPR's Rhythm Atlas, Finnish National Radio and CBC Classical. They were also nominated for the Folk Music Awards as "Best Performing Artists." Payadora won the German world music prize in 2024 (Weltmusikpreis RUTH award) and performed at the famous world music festival, Rudolstadt,

where they received the award. In October 2024, Payadora toured Atlantic Canada with Debut Atlantic.

In January 2025, Payadora performed their show "Tango Apasionado" with PointeTango Dance Company across Florida including shows in Miami, Key West and Palm Coast. Payadora has presented concerts and sold-out shows in Poland, Austria, Brazil, Argentina, at the National Arts Centre. Ottawa Chamberfest. St. Lawrence Centre for the Arts. Toronto's Harbourfront Centre, Stratford Summer Music, Toronto Summer Music, Festival of the Sound, Vancouver Island MusicFest, Toronto Jazzfest, the COC's World Music Series at the Four Seasons Centre, the World Accordion & Tango Festival in Victoria, Music in the Morning in Vancouver, and Vancouver Island Music Festival. Payadora has also collaborated with London Symphonia, the Cathedral Bluffs Symphony and the Hannaford Street Silver Band. Their sold-out 2023 European tour (Madrid, Copenhagen, Budapest and London) included a live-to-air BBC performance.

Rebakah Wolkstein



Rebekah is a passionate chamber musician and a multi-award winning creative force in the Canadian music scene. She is the founder and leader of Payadora, as well as the co-leader

of a new "global sensation" Schmaltz & Pepper, a star studded klezmer/ Yiddish swing ensemble. Rebekah is the first violinist of the Venuti String Quartet. Rebekah is celebrated for her stunning virtuosity, nuance and broad musical versatility. Her creative output has led to multiple composing and recording grants through Canada Council for the Arts, Ontario Arts Council and Toronto Arts Council. She directs multi-disciplinary projects such as The Legend of Carau, a feature for Payadora. She has performed and toured extensively with the Toronto Symphony Orchestra, The National Ballet of Canada, The Canadian Opera Company.

An active studio musician, Rebekah is also at home playing in the styles of Folk, Klezmer, Pop, Latin, and Jazz and can be heard on numerous recordings including new releases by Donovan Woods, Laila Biali, Royal Wood and Justin Gray.

Aside from her active performing career, Rebekah holds a Doctorate in Violin Performance from the University of Toronto as well as degrees in violin from the Cleveland Institute of Music

Drew Jurecka



Drew Jurecka began his relationship with Payadora as record producer for both of their albums. He is an accomplished jazz and session violinist but also as an arranger, producer,

composer and multi-instrumentalist. Trained classically, he studied with Lorand Fenyves and has a degree from the prestigious Cleveland Institute of Music. Drew has spent the last 12 years playing jazz, pop, rock and other contemporary styles in Toronto. Though violin is his primary instrument, he also works frequently as a performer and recording sideman on viola, saxophone, clarinet and mandolin. For five years, Drew played with Jeff Healey as part of his Jazz Wizards band, which toured extensively across Canada. Drew can be heard on three of Jeff Healey's CDs, including the Juno Nominated "Last Call". Drew has also toured nationally and internationally with The Polyjesters, Jesse Cook, Stuart McLean and the Vinyl Cafe, Alex Pangman, the Bebop Cowboys and Jill Barber.

Drew's arrangements have been used on countless records for artists across Canada, the United States and Europe. Drew has written original scores for eight stage plays, including seven for Vancouver-based 'Monster Theatre' and one for Tracey Erin Smith's play "the Burning Bush", which has been performed extensively in Toronto and New York City. He has also written and produced music for film, including the award winning documentary "Cuba Libre" and the recent shorts "An Insignificant Man" and "Sidestep Goosestep".

Drew currently teaches violin at Humber College, where he has helped to create the only specialized jazz strings post-secondary program in Canada. In seven years, the program has quadrupled in size and now includes ensembles, technique and master classes in addition to private lessons. His students have gone on to win international jazz awards and to perform and record in Canada, the US and France. From 2002 - 2011, Drew was the director of the Jazz series at the Northern Lights Music Festival in Guadalajara, Mexico. During that time, he sold out nearly every show, performing with renowned Canadian artists such as Richard Underhill, Daniel Barnes, Terra Hazelton, Sophia Perlman and Jill Barber. He is also a member of the Venuti String Quartet, a crossover quartet with violinist Rebekah Wolkstein

Joe Phillips



Born and raised in Toronto close to the rolling green hills of Christie Pits, Joe Phillips started studying classical guitar at age 9, at the University Settlement House Music School, He

attended Oakwood Collegiate, and after some time playing the clarinet, he discovered the double bass. Time spent playing in various blues bars, Irish pubs and booze cans and four years studying with renowned classical virtuoso Joel Quarrington have led to a busy and diverse career. When not playing principal bass in London Symphonia, Joe can be found making music with artists as varied as The Art of Time Ensemble, Via Salzburg Chamber Orchestra, Group of 27 Chamber Orchestra, cabaret siren Patricia O'Callaghan, songwriters

Jenny Whiteley, Sarah Slean, Ruth Moody, the Wailin' Jennys, Corin Raymond and Rita Chiarelli, jazz bassist/cellist/composer Andrew Downing, banjoist Jayme Stone, Canadian fiddlers Pierre Schryer and Shane Cook and Irish flute and whistle virtuoso Nuala Kennedy. Joe has performed with the National Arts Centre Orchestra, the Toronto Symphony Orchestra, Les Violons du Roy, I Musici de Montréal, Tafelmusik and the Festival of the Sound and is an annual participant in the Sweetwater Music weekend in Owen Sound, Ontario. He lives in London, Ontario with his partner and their two children.

Mark Camilleri



There are so many people in the world who have been quoted as saying "music is a part of life". However, for Mark Camilleri, music is life. Mark's entire professional life embraces music and he has

had a wonderfully varied career for over 35 years. As Marvin Hamlisch put it, "Mark Camilleri, or "Mr. Canada" as I call him, is a one man does it all musical powerhouse, whether he's conducting, or playing keyboards, or arranging."

As a Theatre Music Director, Mark has conducted dozens of productions including "Funny Girl", "Beauty and the Beast", "Nine", "Secret Garden", "West Side Story" and "Mamma Mia". Also, World Premieres of "Pollyanna the Musical", "Juke Box Hero" and "Prom Queen". He has also contracted countless shows for Mirvish Productions. Orchestrating credits include film scores for Directors Atom Egoyan and Érik Canuel, along with commissioned works for The Toronto Symphony and other orchestras and theatre companies across North

America, Mark's concert credits include performing in such venues as The Vatican, The Greek Theatre in Taormina. Notre Dame Church and the Oprah Winfrey Show as well as music directing "The Canadian Songwriters Hall of Fame Gala", the "Canadian Screen Actor Awards", "Canada eh" with Steve Patterson (CBC) and several PBS specials with the Canadian Tenors. Mark was also a featured pianist at the Pan Am opening celebrations and has been honored to have shared the stage with II Divo, Celine Dion, Sting, Eric Clapton, Seth MacFarland, Andrea Bocelli, Paul Anka, Wayne Newton, Sheryl Crow, Sarah McLachlan, David Foster, Annie Lennox, Audra McDonald, Herbie Hancock, The Priests, Dee Snider, Johnny Reid and Jim Cuddy. When he's not behind a piano or podium, you'll find Mark engineering music sessions for TV, Film and radio at his commercial recording studio IMAGINE Sound Studios

Elbio Fernandez



Elbio Fernandez, known as "El pequeño gigante del tango" (the little giant of tango), was born in Uruguay. It was in Uruguay where he learned to love music and tango. In 1989 he moved to

Canada, and in the decades since, he has been performing concerts across North and South America. He has recorded two albums, his own "Elbio Fernandez Tangos" and another one with the Toronto Tango Orchestra. Since 2017, Elbio has been collaborating with superstar group Payadora Tango Ensemble, joining them in different performances and lending his vocals for their latest album "Volando".

Scott Good



Scott Good is a composer, conductor, concert designer and trombonist whose music is driven by the desire to create beauty, evoke emotion, and play with groove. With a belief in the power of

art to enable cathartic events, he has worked with a rich community of musicians, orchestras, ensembles, choreographers, actors, and artists to create intense, meaningful live performance experiences. His music has been described as "a kind of majestic bestial reality" (Globe and Mail), "gloriously cacophonic" (Ottawa Citizen), "sumptuously orchestrated" (Montreal Gazzette), and "dynamic, vivid" (Winnipeg Free Press).

He has composed numerous orchestral works and orchestral arrangement since 2015 in his role of Composer-In-Residence with London Symphonia and previously as Composer-in-Residence with the Vancouver Symphony (2008-2011). His dynamic song cycle, Lasker-Schüler Songs for rising star soprano Midori Marsh and London Symphonia was premiered in 2024. Most recently his orchestral score for the 1926 silent film *The Hands of Orlac* was performed at the screening at the 2024 Forest City Film Festival. Upcoming projects for orchestra include two silent film scores: The Passion of Joan of Arc for a mixture of voices and period instruments to be premiered by Ensemble Caprice in Montreal in 2026, and a two-and-ahalf hour score for large orchestra and chorus celebrating the 100th anniversary of *Metropolis* with the Kingston Symphony (2027).

He has been commissioned by orchestras across Canada, including Orchestre symphonique de Montréal, National Arts Centre Orchestra, Calgary Philharmonic, Winnipeg Symphony, Orchestre de la francophonie, and the Esprit Orchestra. Major works include his multimedia family concert *The Caboose Who Got Loose* with solo cello, narration, and projections (Calgary Philharmonic 2022), and his acclaimed trumpet concerto, *Between the Rooms "a riotous, percussive bacchanal"* (For the Record) with Kitchener-Waterloo Symphony in 2007 and London Symphonia in 2024.

Inspired by the themes of the universal human condition, his lush oratorio *The Sleepers* contemplates the unity and equality of all humanity, whereas *Babbitt*, a raucous saxophone concerto, hailed by *The Vancouver Observer* as "luminous, virtuosic, gleaming music", is inspired by a mid-life crisis. From global extinction cataclysm in his Kurt Vonnegut-inspired jazz orchestra work *Galapagos*, to a boiling stew in his overture *What the Chickpea Said to the Cook*, Scott finds inspiration to create compelling works from all walks and perspectives.

Good's role has evolved over time to include artistic direction. These inclusive programs focus on modern compositions and hybrid genre music. Belonging is a concert of Arabic songs and classical Western compositions with poet/activist Najwa Zebian and songwriter Maryem Toller; In Remembrance, combines classical music with contemporary and traditional songs to reflect the deep, conflicted emotions around the topic of war and sacrifice; and Tapestry, a collaboration with The Light of East Ensemble explores the music of the East Mediterranean. His aim with these diverse programs is to create bridges and connections revealing our common humanity through music.

Good has an extensive catalog of chamber music compositions and has created works for ensembles such as I Furiosi, and the Madawaska String Quartet, organizations such as InnerChamber and the World Harp Congress, and soloists including trombonist Alain Trudel, and electric guitarist Tim Brady. He has composed test pieces for the Montreal International Music Competition, the Canadian Music Competition, and written for education institutions such as the Glenn Gould School and NACO Young Artists program. He has composed several pieces for children as part of Chamber Factory's Listen Up! program and served as a mentor in Esprit Orchestra's Creative Sparks high school program. Current chamber projects include music direction and arranging for the Lonely Child Project, a contemporary music/ contemporary circus hybrid theatrical work in collaboration with multi-hyphenate artist Stacie Dunlop and contemporary circus artists Angola Murdoch and Holly Treddenick, with the music of Claude Vivier (2017-present).

Scott Good's passion for jazz and improvised music can be heard throughout his compositions, especially in hybrid projects with jazz artists and musicians from a variety of cultural backgrounds. Highlights include two major works for the Hard Rubber Jazz Orchestra, Concerto for Cello composed for Jeffrey Zeigler, and Concerto for Improvisor featuring Scott as composer, conductor, and soloist, the concert length crossover project Conjunction, revered as "one of the most fascinating concerts I've heard this year" by the Ottawa Jazz Scene, with the Gryphon Trio, jazz bassist Roberto Occhipinti and American-Cuban drummer Dafnis Prieto, including arrangements and original composition Wu Xing (2018), and his 10-part tribute to author Kurt Vonnegut Vonnegut and the Slaughterhouse Orchestra co-written with singer-songwriter Dwight Schenk for rock band and chamber orchestra.

Scott lives in London Ontario with his wife Jennifer Schofield and two children.






